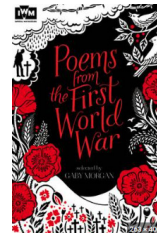

Design and Technology: Summer 1st and 2nd Term 2023

Session 1: DT: Stuffed Toys.

L.O. Design a stuffed toy, considering the main component shapes of their toy.

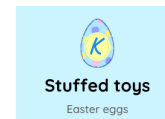
Children to design a stuffed toy for an evacuee.

History— Summer 1st and 2nd Term 2023

Session 1: History: Session 1: History: LO: I can use a variety of sources critically when learning about a past event in British History.

Children working in groups define reliability of sources.

Newspapers, photos, posters, propaganda, letters from the front.



Session 2: History: L.O. To continue to develop chronologically secure knowledge and understand of British, local and world history.

Time line of events which ensured the start of WWI



Session 3: L.O. To study a significant turning point in British history– WW1.

Children to investigate what trenches were like, daily life in a trench etc.



Session 4: History: L.O. To study a significant turning point in British history – WW1.

Children to choose a famous WW1 Battle and to create a poster about what happened and the impact it had on the war. Children to then present to the class in small groups.



Session 5: History: L.O. I am learning to perform study of an aspect of history or a site dating from a period beyond 1066 that is significant in the locality.

Children to research and learn about Elveden's use during WW1– explosives testing. Said to be the most secret base in the

Children to visit the graveyard at Elveden church and see the WW1 graves. Also to choose a soldier and research them online.



Session 7: History: L.O. I can use a variety of sources critically when learning about a past event in British History.

Children to make a factfile/ poster about the soldier they have researched. Encourage children to also explore any family members that served in WW1 or 2.

History— Summer 1st and 2nd Term 2023

Session 8: History: WW2: History: L.O.
I am learning to perform a study of an aspect of history that is significant in the locality.

Children to understand the events that triggered the beginning of WW2, including the significance WW1 had in leading up to the 2nd World War.



Session 9: History: L.O. I can use a variety of sources critically when learning about a past event in British History.

Children to analyse sources, identifying the impact on the home front during WW2: rationing, bombing, evacuation etc.



Session 10: History: L.O. To study a significant turning point in British history— WW2.

Children to understand the need to evacuate and the devastation of the Blitz. Are there any people in our locality still alive who have memories of the 2nd World War? Invite them in!



Session 11: History: L.O. I am learning to explore the changing powers of leaders and the impact they can have.

Children to learn about the holocaust using drama activities and hot seating. Children to understand the impact of the holocaust and why it still affects people throughout the world today.

Geography— Summer 1st and 2nd Term 2023

Session 1: Geography: L.O. I am learning to locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia).

Children to map out and locate all the countries involved in WW1 in Europe.



Session 2: Geography: L.O. I am learning to locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia).

Children to identify countries that were invaded, key battle ground and how country borders changed during the war.



Session 3: Geography: L.O. I am learning to locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia).

Children to identify which countries fought in World War 2 and compare to the countries involved in World War 1. Children to also identify alliances between countries.



5 Key Questions: Geography

1. Which countries were involved in WW1?
2. Which was the first country invaded by Germany in WW2?
3. Why was this such a key event in history?
4. What were the various modes of transport used in the war?
5. How would the war have effected the population of these countries involved?

Science

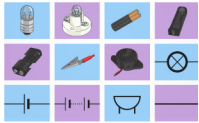
Summer 1st Term 2023:

Session 1: Science: Complete circuits!

L.O. To use recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram.

Children to begin by being given 1 bulb, 1 wire and 1 battery to make a complete circuit.

Children to look at the history of electricity and how it has changed our lives and also draw the symbols for parts of the circuits.



Session 2: Science: Light Brightness!

L.O. Associate the brightness of a lamp or the volume of a buzzer with the number and voltage of cells used in the circuit.

Children to investigate batteries and light brightness.



Initial Assessment: Initial Assessment.

LO: I am learning to use scientific vocabulary linked to our topic of learning.

LO: I am learning to explain what I already know about electricity. Creating a mind-map. Vocab taught in tiers.



Session 3: Science: Wire investigation.

L.O. Compare and give reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches.

Children to investigate wire length and its affect on bulb brightness.

Write up investigation.



Session 4: Science: Electricity investigation.

L.O. Compare and give reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches.

Children to look at why scientist are needed to be accurate and trusted in their results and participate in another investigation. Write up investigation.

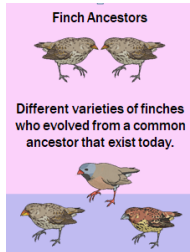
Summer 2nd Term 2023: Revision Sessions

Session 1: Science: Evolution and Inheritance.

L.O. Recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents.

Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.

Recap session on the two key objectives from the Evolution and Inheritance module.



Session 2: Science: Earth and Space

L.O. Describe the Sun, Earth and Moon as approximately spherical bodies .

L.O. describe the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system

L.O. Describe the movement of the Moon relative to the Earth.

Session 3: Science: Forces

L.O. Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object.

L.O. Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces.

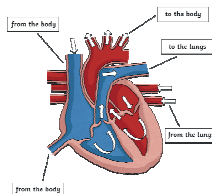
