Africa	Africa is the world's second largest continent after Asia.
Animals	Animals are living things.
Atlas	It is a bound collection of maps.
Capital City	Where the regions Government is located.
Climate	Measurement of temperature, wind, humidity, snow and rain in a place.
Continent	This is one of Earth's seven main divisions of the land.
Culture	Is a pattern of behavior shared by a society or a group of people.
Globe	The Earth.
